Judging Criteria

To assist candidates to assemble appropriate information for the consideration of the judging panel, listed below are details of the judging criteria and weightings that are used as part of the evaluation of nominations:

- Significant Railway Engineering/Technology Achievement (x 5)
- Demonstrably Successful (x 5)
- Degree of Originality/Innovation (x 5)
- Engineering Ability Displayed (x 5)
- Utilisation of Resources (x 3)
- Environmental Benefit/Sustainability (x 4)
- Clarity of Entry Submission/Information (x 2)

Guidelines to Nominators

In the following, the RTSA presents to potential nominators (self or third party) the following guidelines for the collation and submission of high quality and meaningful nominations.

- Write the nomination on the basis that the members of the Awards Sub-Committee know nothing about the project that is being nominated.
- Write the nomination on the assumption that it will be considered purely on its merits alone, and that any past, related nominations will not have any bearing on the current nomination.
- Write the nomination in the knowledge that the members of the Awards Sub-Committee will be able to consider only what is presented to them in the nomination form and its attachments.
- Write the nomination with a view to presenting material about the nominated project that addresses the judging criteria, bearing in mind the weightings which will be applied to those criteria by the Awards Sub-Committee.
- Recognise that the nomination shall have a principal objective of identifying the main attributes of and the contributions that have been made by the nominated project.

Condition of Entry

It is a condition of entry that all candidates shall ensure that a representative of the employer or sponsoring company shall be present at the Awards Presentation Dinner (payment to attend will be required) which is held in conjunction with the CORE conference in the year of the Award.
